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# **1. Executive Summary**

This deliverable aims to describe the workshop on Digital Preservation held in Ankara on 7 July 2011.

The deliverable is composed by six chapters: Chapter 1 is this executive summary Chapter 2 introduces the scope of the workshop Chapter 3 provides information about the agenda of the workshop Chapter 4 provides some pictures from the workshop Chapter 5 described the attendees to the workshop Chapter 6 provides a short biography of the speakers and the link to the website where the presentations are available for download Chapter 7 presents some conclusions about the results of the workshop and the lessons learnt.

The day after the workshop, the work continued with the project partners from Turkey, Italy, Spain, Egypt, the expert from the Italian National Library Marciana (Venice) and the representatives of Tubitak, with a special focus on the discussion about the content of D5.1, the use case study deliverable about Long-term preservation to be produced in the frame of the INDICATE project. No formal presentation was planned for the second day. Minutes of the meeting are available in the reserved area of the project website.

## 2. Workshop presentation

The first day of the workshop was planned as open for all participants. After the welcome speech, the presentation of INDICATE was given by the project coordinator Mrs. Antonella Fresa and Turkish partner Mr. Bahadir Aydinonat to the Turkish community. Turkish NREN and Grid provider Tubitak explained the NREN and Grid Infrastructure in Turkey, what they did offer to institutions and their users and some technical information about the network structure. After that, Prof. Dr. Bulent Yilmaz gave detailed information on the digitisation case studies in Turkey and the relevant project Access-it. International practices on preservation were shared to participants like Magazini Digitali from Italy and Cultnat from Egypt. Lastly, Ankara City Archive project by Atilim University and Turkish National Library digitization and preservation experiences were shared.

The scope of the workshop was to present the best practice examples of digital preservation, to discuss how e-Infrastructures can be used to solve digital preservation problems, to analyze the resources which e- Infrastructures offer, and how they can be deployed to deal with digital preservation.

The workshop was targeted to digital cultural heritage specialists: ICT providers, librarians, personnel specially working on digitization and preservation of heritage.

The second day was planned as a group activity, where partners discussed deliverables and survey results. Please, refer to D5.1 for full information about the Long-term Preservation survey carried out by the INDICATE project. Turkish partner Bahadir Aydinonat summarized the survey results per country and gave information about preservation strategies / policies, NREN Grid Connections etc. Tubitak gave a report about a TERENA study on the connection of cultural institutions. NREN and Grid possibilities for each country were discussed. Lastly, the deliverables about the review, handbook and a new shortened preservation survey was planned for the next project meeting.

# 7. Conclusions

The workshop in Ankara was the first of the events planned in INDICATE.

The event was successful and the initiation of the dialogue between the cultural sector and the e-infrastructure providers in Turkey was very interesting.

The international experiences presented at the workshop enriched the knowledge of the participants who actively participated to the discussion with questions and comments to each presentation.

Two themes were particularly discussed:

- The first theme relates to the meaning of digital preservation in the cultural sector. It is clear that the definition varies very much: from the preservation of the data storage from physical damages due for example to fire and floods (this is for example the approach of the Italian national project "Magazzini Digitali") to the tools for recovering loss, repairing digital objects and in general conceptual frameworks for quality assurance, up to supporting the long-term usability fo the digital resources through a life cycle approach that should include reasoning and intelligence in the content itself. The participants to the workshop recommended to address these points in future events and initiatives, in order to arrive to a more informed and common understanding of the problems related to the different implementations of digital preservation projects.
- The second theme relates to the possibilities to establish concrete and factual cooperation between the e-infrastructures and the cultural sector. They are still rather far one from the other, they do not know each other and do not know the level of expertise owned in the respective areas. The technological aspects of the e-infrastructures are often perceived as a barrier by the cultural sector, while the sophisticated elaboration in the definition of metadata standards in the cultural sector are often unknown by the e-infrastructure people. There is a strong need of progressing in knowing each other.

In general, the results of the workshop have been very encouraging, also for the opportunities that this kind of activity seems to open to both sectors: to the e-infrastructure providers that can find in the cultural sector a new demanding and interested customer and to the cultural sector that can find in the e-infrastructures advanced solutions to progress in the digitization and all the related issues, including specifically the digital preservation.
